

## Medi-Span Updates to the Multi-Source Code

The Medi-Span Multi-Source Code differentiates, at the NDC level, whether a given drug is considered a single-source product or a multi-source product. RxLogic refers to this as the MONY Code. Please note that the Multi-Source Code is assigned based on active products associated with a given GPI.

To simplify and better support customer use cases, Medi-Span is changing their editorial policy for the assignment of Multi-Source Code values for active drugs, as follows:

### Prescription Drug Products

Current Policy	New Policy	Result

### Over The Counter (OTC) Drug Products

One of the following values may be assigned: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• N</li> <li>• Y</li> <li>• O</li> </ul>	Only one of the following values can be assigned: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• N</li> <li>• Y</li> </ul>	<b>N:</b> If the drug product is the only active product associated with its GPI or meets one of the exclusion criteria which includes Prenatal Vitamins, Bulk Chemicals, and Devices. For full list, see FAQs. <b>Y:</b> If the drug product is not the only active product associated with its GPI and does not meet the exclusion criteria listed above.

The attached report includes anticipated changes to the Multi-Source Code value for affected Exclusion List and OTC Drug Products. These changes will be effective on January 1, 2026.



List of drug products from FAQs noted above:

**Q:** Which drug products are considered Multi-Source Code exclusions and will be assigned the value “N” (indicating “not applicable”)?

**A:** Drug products that will be assigned the value “N” indicating Not Applicable are identified in the following table. If any one of these criteria applies, the value “N” will be assigned.

Multiple Vitamins w/Calcium	GPI starts with 7835
Pediatric Vitamins	GPI starts with 7840
Pediatric Multiple Vitamins	GPI starts with 7841
Ped Multiple Vitamins w/Minerals	GPI starts with 7842
Ped MV w/Iron	GPI starts with 7843
Ped MV w/Fluoride	GPI starts with 7844
Specialty Vitamins Products	GPI starts with 7850
